



Reception - Choosing Time


During this time, encourage your child to choose what they would like to play with and to select their own resources.

At the end of the story, the dragon was reading a book "The Dragon who didn't like Fire" - Could you come up with an idea for this story? Draw a story board.


Design your own dragon?

Do you have your own unique talent? What makes you special? Create a "special about me" poster or box to collect items that represent your personality and qualities.


Play a game of snakes and ladders

Get creative! Can you make a model/collage/puppet of any reptile of your choice?






Ideas

Be a scientist! Create an experiment to see whether objects sink or float?

Do you remember in the story, the little crocodile learns about floating and sinking. With a rubber ring, he could float on top of the water, but without it, the little crocodile sank down towards the bottom of the river!

Water table activity: (This activity can be enjoyed indoors, or outdoors!)

1. Fill a shallow plastic tub, or large bowl with some water.
2. Invite your child to help you collect items from around the home that can get wet: cups, plastic bowls, sponges, straws, coins, toys, etc.
3. Ask your child to predict which items will sink or float, then drop them in the water one at a time to observe the outcome!
